

Historical, Unusual & Big Trees

Citizens of Coeur d'Alene have great interest in trees, and have planted and nurtured a wide variety of tree species. Coeur d'Alene, with the assistance of the Panhandle Kiwanis Club and an Idaho Community Forestry grant, has published a guide to some of the City's trees that are unusual, the largest of their species, or have historical significance. First published in 1992, this guide to "Historical, Unusual & Big Trees of Coeur d'Alene" was updated in 2000. The most recent version of this publication will be printed in 2009. To nominate a tree, print this form, fill it out, and send it to the address listed below.

Historical Trees are those individual trees or groups of trees that have a significant place in the history of our community.

Unusual Trees are those of a species rarely found in this area, or trees that have unusual or unique characteristics.

Big Trees are the largest of their species. The winner is determined by the national "big tree" formula, which is based on trunk circumference, tree height, and crown spread.

Nominated trees must be located within the Coeur d'Alene city limits. To be considered for inclusion in the "Historical, Unusual & Big Tree" publication, trees must also be observable by the public from the street or other public area.
