

The Meeting was called to order by the Mayor.

AT This time Fred S. Merrill was sworn in as councilman from the fourth ward and took his place at the council table.

ROLL CALL The following Councilmen answered to roll call, Pierce, McDonald, Sonnichsen, Frandsen, Field, Hurrell, Merrill, Fender.

MINUTES The Minutes of the regular meeting of the city council held Sept. 3rd were read and approved.

FIRE HYDRANT 9th AND LOCUST A petition from residents asking that a fire hydrant be installed at the corner of 9th street and Locust ave. was read, and it was moved by Hurrell seconded by Merrill and carried that the fire chief be authorized to order a fire hydrant and install same when it comes.

BICYCLE RACK AT DREAM THEATER The manager of the Dream Theater appeared before the council and asked that the city remove a meter at the Dream Theater to permit the installation of a bicycle rack to keep the bicycles off the sidewalk, after considerable discussion it was moved by McDonald seconded by Fender and carried that the police committee check into the matter to see what can be done to provide parking space for all the bicycle in the down town area.

UNLOADING ZONE, COMMERCIAL TIRE SHOP In the matter of a loading zone in front of the commercial tire shop at 519 sherman ave. it was moved by Pierce seconded by McDonald and carried that the street and alley committee be give power to act in the matter.

ORDINANCE NO. 842 ORDINANCE NO 842, AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED, AN ORDINANCE VACATING THE ALLEY IN BLOCK THIRTEEN(13) GLENMORE ADDITION TO COEUR D'ALENE KOOTENAI COUNTY, IDAHO.

Ordinance No. 842 was read the first time by the clerk in its entire and it was moved by Fender seconded by Merrill and carried on roll call vote that Ordinance No. 842 pass its first reading.

Thereupon it was moved by Pierce seconded by Hurrell and carried on roll call vote that the rules requiring an Ordinance to be read on three different occasions be suspended and that Ordinance No. 842 pass its second and third readings by title only.

Thereupon Ordinance No. 842 was read the second time by the clerk by title only and it was moved by Hurrell seconded by McDonald and carried on roll call vote that Ordinance No. 842 pass its second reading.

Thereupon Ordinance No. 842 was read the third time by the clerk by title only and it was moved by Pierce seconded by Fender and carried on roll call vote that Ordinance No. 842 pass its third reading.

It was then moved by Frandsen seconded by Sonnichsen and unanimously carried on roll call vote that Ordinance NO. 842 be declared a duly enacted ordinance of the city of Coeur d'Alene and was so declared by the Mayor.

TRANSFER OF BEER LICENSE Moved by Hurrell seconded by Fender and carried that the beer license issued on Dutches Grocery store be transferred from James McMurray to George Negrey.

ZONING ORDINANCE At this time the Zoning Ordinance was taken up for passage but as the ordinance and the land use map did not coincide it was moved by Frandsen seconded by Fender and carried that passage of the ordinance be postponed until Sept. 30th and that in the meantime the necessary corrections be made in the ordinance and map.

PURCHASE CEMETERY LOT. Moved by Pierce seconded by McDonald and carried on roll call vote that the city purchase from Mrs. W. E. Grant, the south 4 feet of Lot 3, Block 43, Sec. "F" Forest Cemetery, for \$14.28 this purchase to be made from the cemetery investment fund.

STOP SIGN AT MULLAN ROAD AND BY-PASS Moved by Pierce seconded by Fender and carried that the police committee investigate the situation at the stop sign at the intersection of Mullan Road and 95, to see what can be done to enforce observance of the signs at that location, and recommend some action to the council.

WAYNE CROSS ON POLICE DEPT. Moved by Field seconded by Hurrell and carried that Wayne Cross be hired as night desk clerk for the police Dept. until such time as Emmett Barnes is able to return to work.

SALARY INCREASE POLICE AND FIRE DEPT. Moved by Fender seconded by Hurrell and carried that the police and Fire committees take under advisement the matter of a salary raise for the police and fire depts. and see if they can find ways and means of an increase for the two depts.

JUNIOR TOASTERS TO TAKE OVER CITY OCTOBER 1, 1946 Moved by Fender seconded by Hurrell and carried that the Mayor and Council, turn over to the Junior Toastmasters the reigns of the city for one day, October 1, 1946, and that all department heads cooperate and help them in every way possible so that they may gain the maximum benefit from their one days rule.
