## **Coeur d'Alene Begins Major Street Overlay Repair**

The City of Coeur d'Alene will place more than three miles of new asphalt on streets throughout the community through mid-August,

and drivers are urged to use caution while in road work areas. Streets being "overlayed"—where old asphalt is ground up and new asphalt is placed—include Front Avenue and portions of its side streets between 8th & 21st streets; Hanley Avenue between Ramsey Road and Highway 95; and Dalton



Avenue between N. Stafford Road and N. Pleasant Way. Motorists are asked to use caution in these areas. The City of Coeur d'Alene spends about \$1.2 million annually on street maintenance, including overlay and chip sealing, to ensure a great commute for residents and visitors. ## CDA Arts Commission Accepting Mayor's Awards in the **Arts Nominations**




