Cd'A Library Hours Temporarily Modified

The hours for the Coeur d'Alene Public Library have been temporarily modified in response to issues related to the COVID-19 Pandemic. Library Hours Monday through Saturday are 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. The Sunday hours will remain noon to 5 p.m.

Lake City Public Library, in the high school on Ramsey Road, is closed due to construction at the school. Its status will be reviewed in the coming weeks as local schools resume.

The meeting rooms, teen areas, and children's library will remain temporarily closed. Their reopening depends on a sustained decline in coronavirus infection rates. All library programs will continue online for the time being.

City Announces Small Business Relief Fund Grant Program

The City of Coeur d'Alene announces that it has reserved \$340,000 in CARES Act funding for Small Business Relief Grants. The grant program is available to businesses and organizations (including non -profits and licensed in-home childcare providers) registered with the State of Idaho and located within the City of Coeur d'Alene jurisdictional boundaries. In the first round of the grant allocation, eligible expenses for businesses will be focused on keeping kids healthy and making Coeur d'Alene safer for residents and visitors.
