

This test covers aspects of obedience, agility and searching. All three also passed their Certification Evaluation in November. The dogs and their trainers did well and were a great representation of Coeur d'Alene.

Firefighter/Paramedic Erik Loney was nominated by his peers and selected by the CDA Fire Department as the Firefighter/ Paramedic of the year to receive a public safety award at the CDA Regional Chamber of Commerce Public Safety Awards luncheon on June 7th.

Fire Prevention Division

- Fire Inspectors underwent a title change from Fire Inspector to Deputy Fire Marshal (DFM) to better reflect their assigned tasks and duties.
- ◆ DFM Bobby Gonder was subpoenaed for testimony on four arson cases (three fires in CDA and one for expert testimony in a jurisdiction outside CDA).
- ◆ DFM Craig Etherton completed Advanced PIO and Youth Intervention Specialist training programs (Y.I.S. is formerly known as Juvenile Fire Setters). He also attended the annual International Training Conference of the International Association of Arson Investigators in Jacksonville, Florida.
- DFM Gonder attended the International Fire Investigators conference in Boise.
- ♦ 30 fire investigations were performed.
- DFM Gonder conducted two Juvenile Firesetter Intervention evaluations
- Attended 49 project reviews for new construction or remodel projects within the City (38 new, 11 remodel).
- Currently working on the Firefighter Air Replenishment Systems Ordinance. The new hi-rise building at 3rd and Front will be the first building in CDA to have the FARS installed.
- Reviewed 226 permits for new construction or remodels and performed required code inspections for all.
