IN THE NEWS

Water Wisely Coeur d'Alene

Water consumption has risen by two-to-three times the average annual amount in the past three-months. The City experienced a record setting maximum day demand of 42.76 million gallons per day (MGD) on July 1. The peak usage normally occurs in mid-August. A press release was published the first week of July, urging a voluntary citywide water conservation effort in order to reduce the peak consumption during the extreme drought and hot, arid conditions. Daily water consumption has been reduced to 35-39 MGD. In order to help mitigate the increased demands, the City is constructing a new well that will be operational in late fall.

To help with the water conservation efforts the City's Parks Department has reduced watering schedules of City parks and greenspaces to every other day which has shown to be a tremendous help to reduce the demand on the public water system.

Here are some quick tips to keep in mind:

- Please do not water between the hours of 12:00 pm and 6:00 pm.
- Please water every other day.
- If you have an odd numbered address please water on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. If you have an even numbered address water on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday.
- Please check that your irrigation system is working properly and that overwatering is not occurring.

- Always ride your bike in the direction of traffic. Make predictable moves so traffic doesn't have to guess what your intentions are.
- The speed limits on trails is 15mph. If you want to go faster, use the on-street bike lanes. The trails have pedestrians, dog walkers, strollers and wheelchairs. Excessive speed is dangerous.
- Night riding is great in the summertime. Many bike shops have full moon rides on a monthly basis. Please remember to wear reflective clothing and use a headlight or head lamp.

Extreme Fire Danger and Stage 2 Restrictions in Kootenai County

Due to the current drought conditions and the current fuel moisture levels, the current fire danger level is being raised to **EXTREME** throughout the Mica Fire Protection District.

If you have any questions, contact your local fire jurisdiction.



STAGE II Fire Restrictions are in effect in this area. Thank you for being careful with fire and, please, call 911 to report any wildfires.



FIRES OR CHARCOAL

Prohibited: Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire, or stove fire.

Exceptions: Persons using a fire or stove fire fueled solely by liquid petroleum or LPG fuels. Such devices, including propane campfires, may be used only in an area clear of flammable material.



SMOKING

Prohibited: Smoking outside an enclosed vehicle or building. Exceptions: You can smoke while stopped in an area at least 3 feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable materials.

Cross Country Travel

Prohibited: Operating motorized vehicles off designated roads and trails.



Chainsaws/Other Equipment

Prohibited: The following acts are prohibited from 1:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. - Operating a chainsaw or other equipment powered by an internal combustion engine; blasting, welding, or other activities that generate flame or flammable material; or using an explosive.

Remember – Fireworks are illegal on public lands.
