- In October, the Wastewater Department, in conjunction with the Library, gave over 900 pumpkins away. It was a record year for pumpkins grown on the Wastewater Department's pumpkin patches.
- On October 5, 2023, the inaugural Lawyer in the Library clinic was held at the Library. The program provides an opportunity for low-income individuals and families in Idaho's panhandle to receive free legal advice on a wide array of civil legal issues, including family law, probate, small claims, disability, and elder law issues. - The Coeur d'Alene Police Department will be collecting new and used toys for the 8th Annual Children's Hospital Toy Drive which directly benefits local children who may be in the hospital during the holiday season. Last year over \$20,000 worth of toys were collected and distributed to children at Kootenai Health and Sacred Heart.
- On November 2, City employees participated in St. Vincent de Paul's "Souport" to help fund warming shelters in Coeur d'Alene.

Recreation Department Registrations

Kindergarten, 1st, and 2nd Grade Boys and Girls Basketball

The Coeur d'Alene Recreation Department basketball registration will be held from December 11 - January 3 for the Kindergarten, 1st, and 2nd grade boys and girls basketball leagues. The program is set to begin approximately the third week in January and run through mid-March. Cost is \$35.00 for city residents and \$40.00 for non-city residents.

Indoor Swim Lesson Registration

Lawyer in the Library

The Coeur d'Alene City Attorney's Office worked with the Idaho Volunteer Lawyers Program (IVLP) over the summer to bring a free legal clinic to the Coeur d'Alene area. Through a partnership with the CDA Library, that effort came to fruition on October 5, 2023, when the inaugural Lawyer in the Library clinic was held. The program provides an opportunity for low-income individuals and families in Idaho's panhandle to receive free legal advice on a wide array of civil legal issues, including family law, probate, small claims, disability, and elder law issues. Although the volunteer lawyers are unable to assist with criminal matters or fee generating cases, and their assistance is limited to the advice given during the clinic, it is nevertheless an opportunity for those in need to receive free legal advice and counseling from local attorneys willing to give of their time and expertise to help others.

This free legal clinic takes place on the first Thursday of each month from 4 to 6 p.m. in the Gozzer and Jameson Rooms in the lower level of the Library. <u>Registration is required</u> and must be done at least 24 hours prior to the clinic.

While everyone is always welcome at the Library, this event is intended for adults.



Kyle Marine Promoted to Water Superintendent

Due to long-time Water Superintendent Terry Pickel's retirement, the City went through the recruitment process for a new Water Superintendent. Kyle Marine was chosen for the Superintendent position.

Kyle began his career with the City of Coeur d'Alene in April of 2004 as a Utility Operator 1 and has worked his way up through the department. Within a few years of being hired, Kyle was promoted to a Utility Supervisor. In 2016, Kyle was again promoted to Assistant Water Superintendent where he had worked



closely with Superintendent Terry Pickel to manage the day-to-day operations of the Water Department.
