2021 Youth Sports Registration

BOYS BASEBALL AND GIRLS SOFTBALL FOR AGES 5-12

Coeur d'Alene Recreation Department boys baseball and girls slowpitch softball registration for 5 – 12 year old's will be open May 3 - 21. Games are held Monday – Thursday evenings. Practices begin approximately June 10, and games begin the week of June 28. Registration is at Coeur d'Alene City Hall, 710 E. Mullan Avenue. Office hours are 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., Monday – Friday. Registration fee is \$20.00 for city residents and \$30.00 for non-city residents.

INDOOR SWIM LESSON REGISTRATION

Registration will begin Monday, June 7, at 8:00 A.M., for the next six week session of indoor swim lessons sponsored by the Coeur d'Alene Recreation Department and held at the Kootenai Health Therapeutic Pool. Classes offered for 3-9 years of age, with different swim levels available. Classes offered for this session will be either Monday or Wednesday evenings or Saturday mornings. Classes start the week of June 14. Registration will take place at Coeur d'Alene City Hall Recreation Department, 710 E. Mullan Avenue. The registration fee is \$40.00. There is limited registration. No pre-registration is allowed. For more information on those classes call 208-769-2250. Covid restrictions are in effect, which will require masking for the one parent that is allowed to attend and social distancing for the parent. No additional siblings will be allowed to attend unless they are in a swim class.

US-95/NW Blvd Swale Project Update

The installation of the 24" storm line under US-95 is complete. Streets & Engineering crews will now armor the discharge point. Once the grass is established this new swale will be put on line, effectively removing the direct injection of untreated stormwater runoff from the river.


Alzheimer's and Dementia Education- Understanding Alzheimer's and Dementia
