Quench Thirsty Plants Without Wasting Water

Summer is just around the corner, along with some hot spells that will make gardens thirsty. Here are some tips to keep your garden watered all season long, and avoid soggy soils, heat-stressed plants and wasted water.

- **Irrigate slowly and less often.** This enables water to absorb slowly into the soil, promoting better moisture retention and healthy root growth.
- **Add mulch.** A two- to four-inch layer of mulch around your plants' roots helps lower soil temperature and helps retain moisture.
- **Water based on plants' needs.** Watering needs vary depending on plant age, species and location so familiarize yourself with those needs.
- **Water the soil, not the plants.** Wet leaves can foster leaf spotting and attract pests. Watering at the base of plants maximizes the amount of water that reaches the roots.
- **Be strategic with sprinklers.** Don't water paths, driveways or bare soil if this can be avoided.
- **Water in the morning.** Watering in the morning allows for plant roots to absorb more moisture before midday heat speeds up the evaporation process.

Join the Library for a fun-filled afternoon exploring the unique art of flower pounding. Tataki-Zomé is the ancient Japanese art of dyeing by hammering flowers and plants onto fabric or paper. Design a tote bag, apron, or bucket hat using an assortment of fresh flowers and leaves, then, use hammers to transfer the natural pigments onto the fabric for a bag unique to you! Meet outside on the McEuen Park side of the Library. Please feel free to bring any fresh flowers or greenery you would like to use or share!

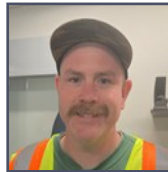

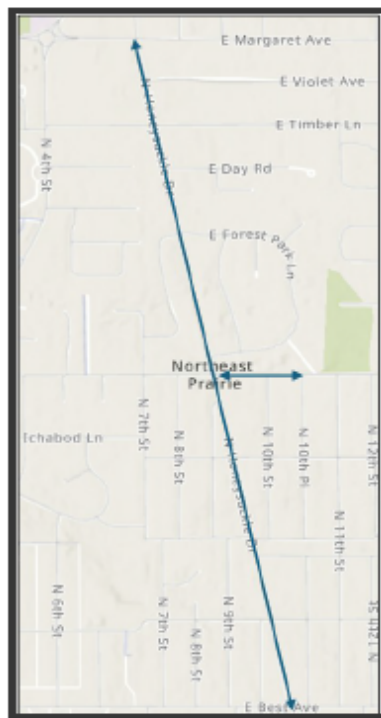
