



## CRIME TREND WITH POPULATION



#### **■ Person Crimes**



### Part 1 & 2 Crime Arrests by Year



#### **Adult, Juvenile & Total Arrests**



#### Calls for Service: 2019 - 2024






Types of calls that Code Enforcement typically handles include:


#### **Accidents by Year & Season**

## Coeur d'Alene Police: Volunteer Program

Volunteers spend time serving Investigations, Patrol, Records, Community Relations Unit and COPS (Citizens on Patrol) program.

Our 11 civilian volunteers spent just over 1,100 hours serving the department in 2024. During this time, they handled 562 abandoned vehicles and issued 345 parking related citations.



Volunteer efforts free up more officers for criminal investigations and patrol related duties, and we are very grateful for their efforts.

In February of 2024 the CDA City Council approved Chief White's request to form a two-person opioid task force.

The task force's roles include responding to overdose calls, providing assistance to overdose victims and family members, investigating illegal opioid trafficking and distribution and providing training to public safety personnel and community groups regarding Opioid Use Disorder.
