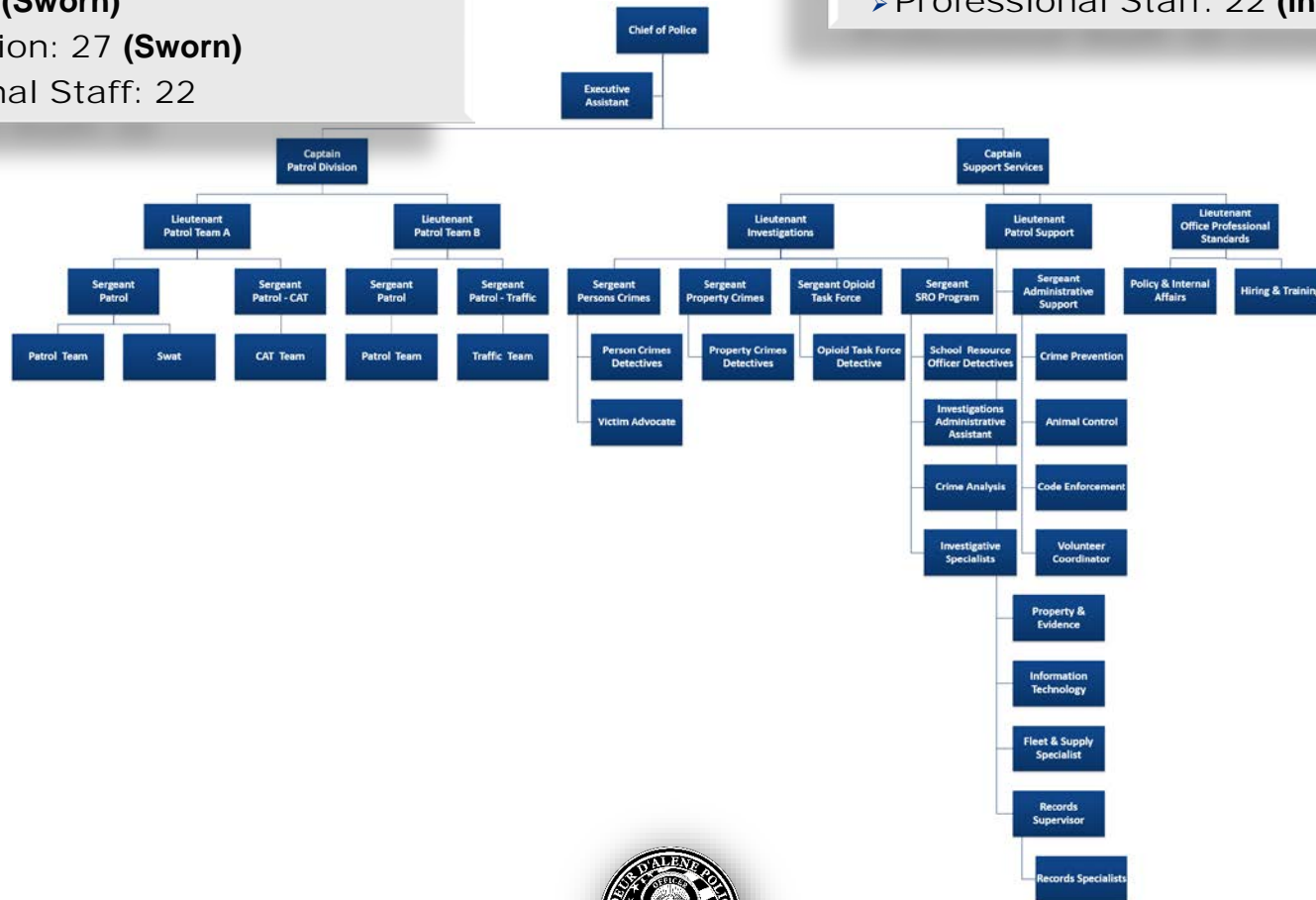

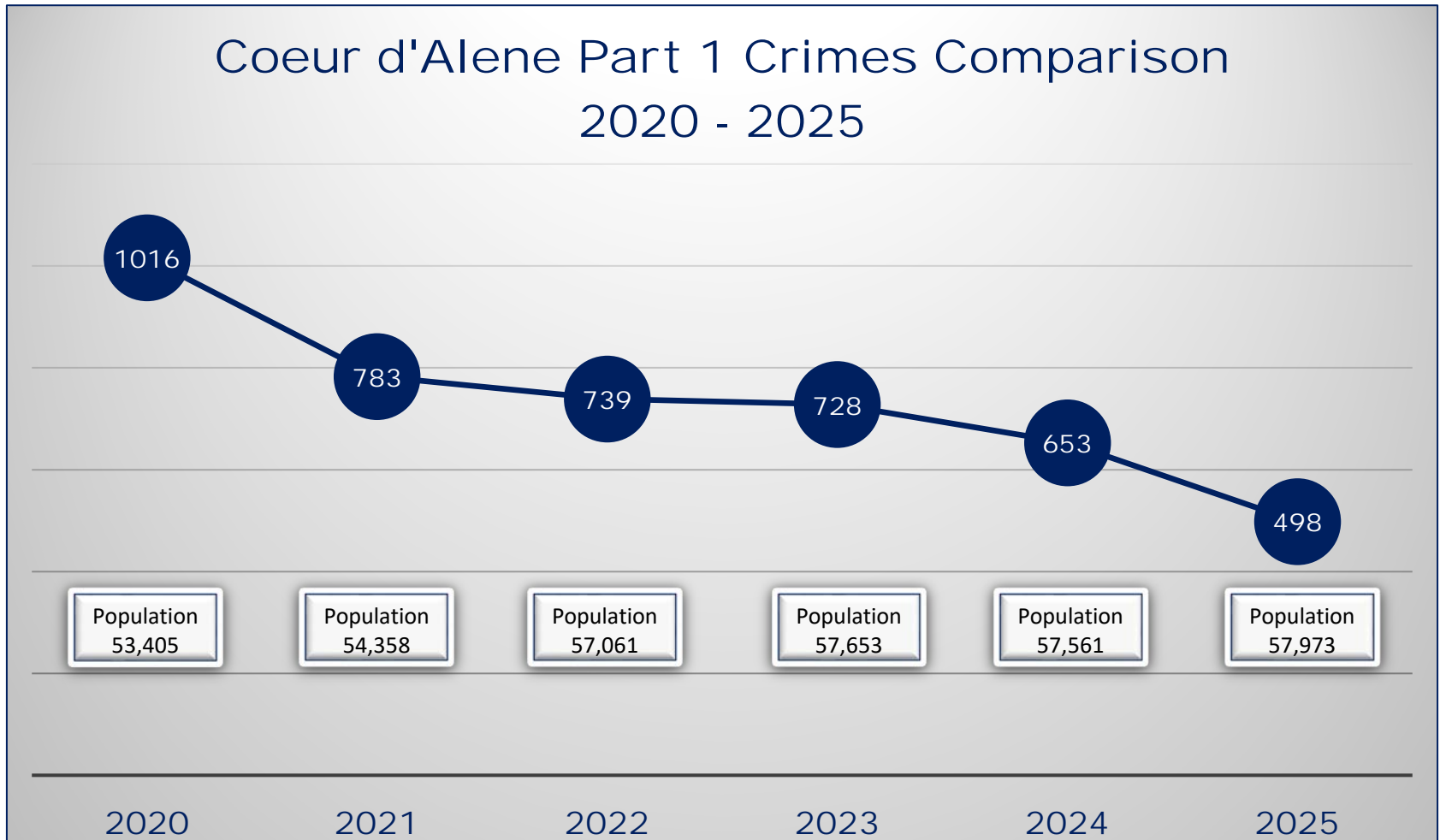

CRIME TREND WITH POPULATION

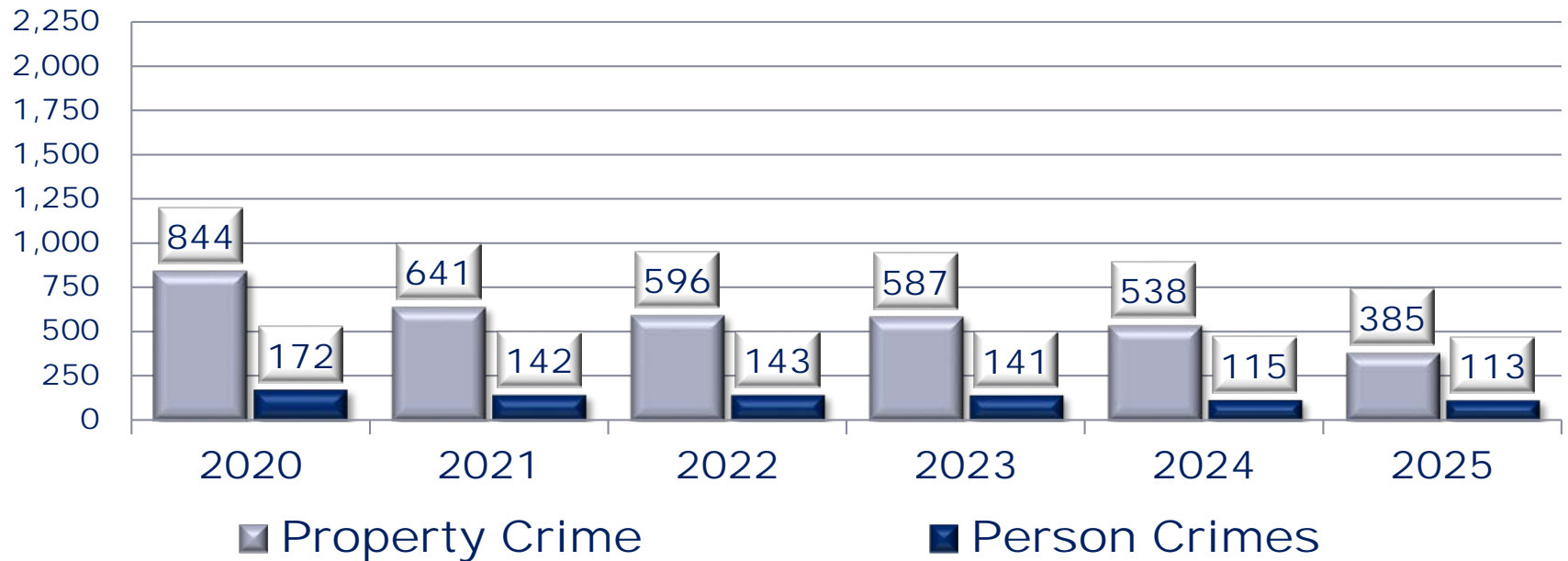

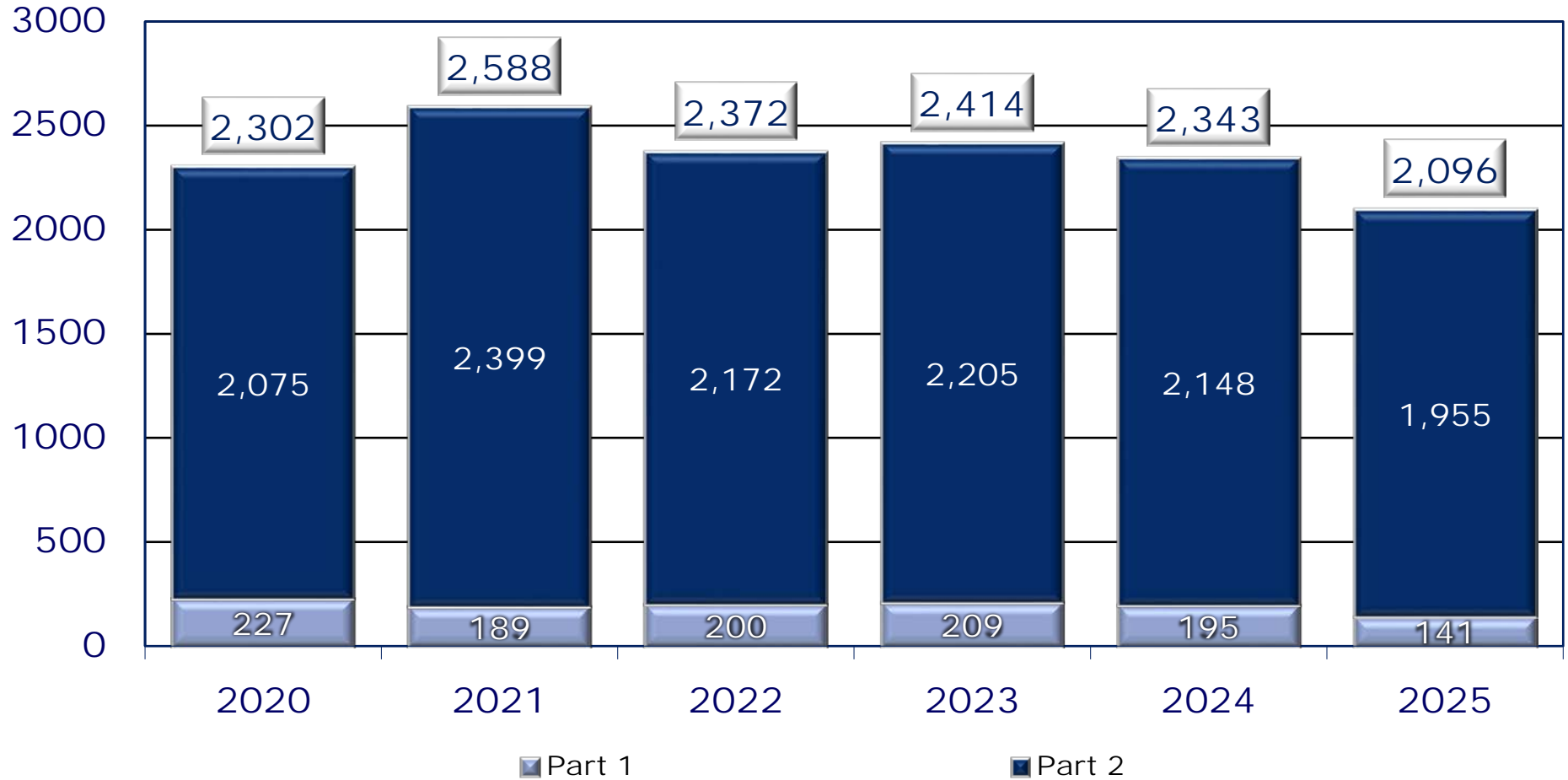

Part 1 & 2 Crime Arrests by Year

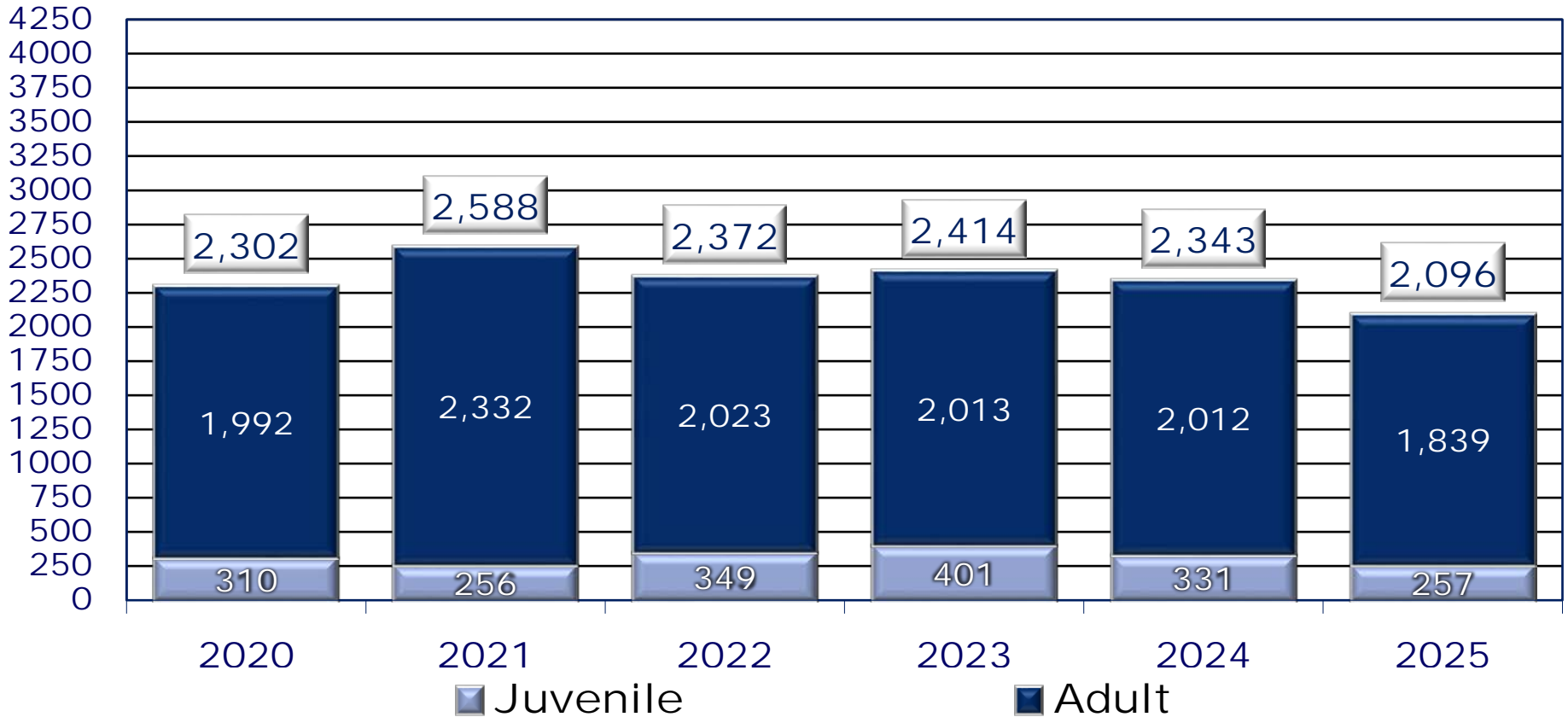

Adult, Juvenile & Total Arrests

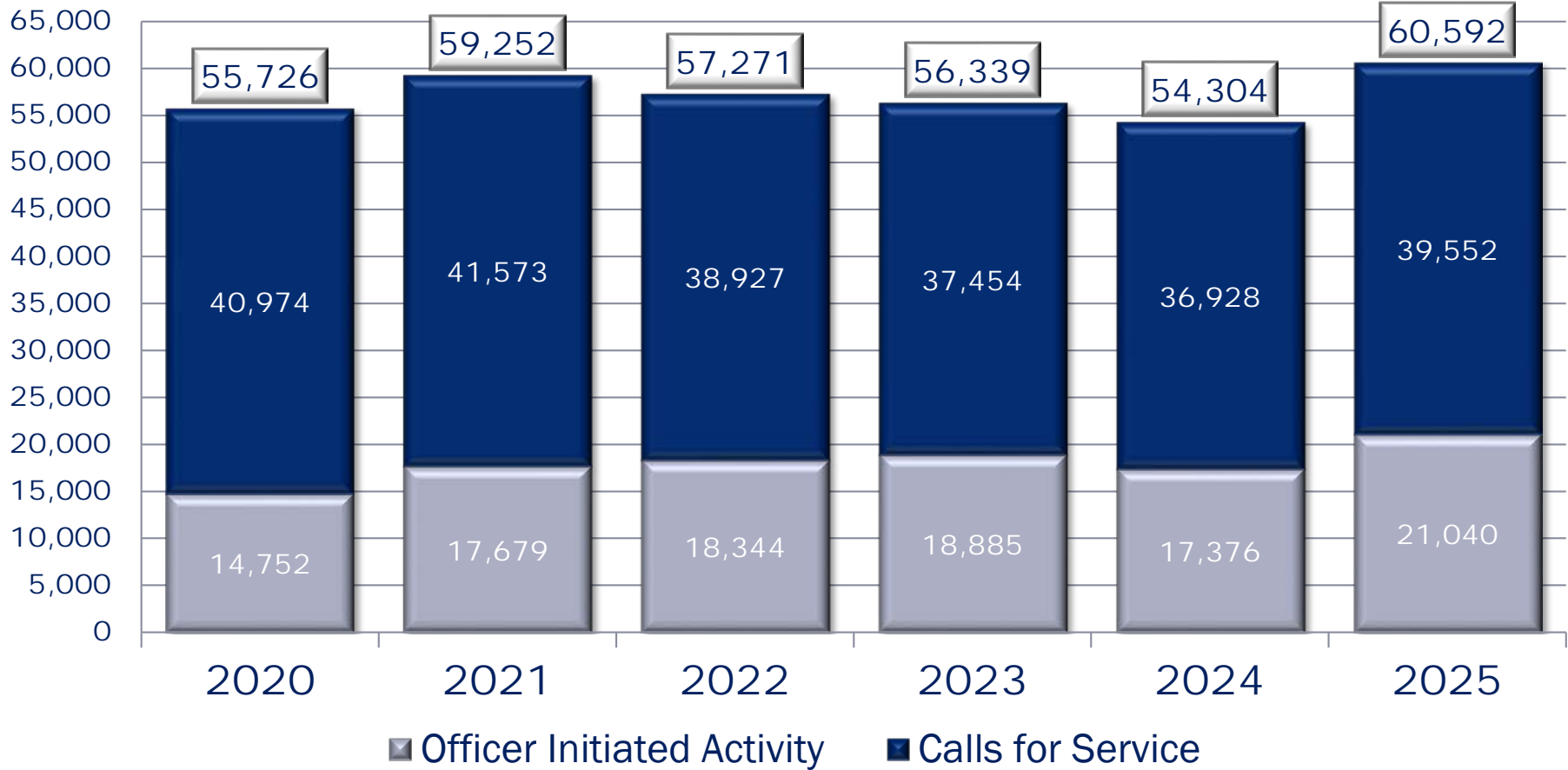

Calls for Service: 2020 - 2025

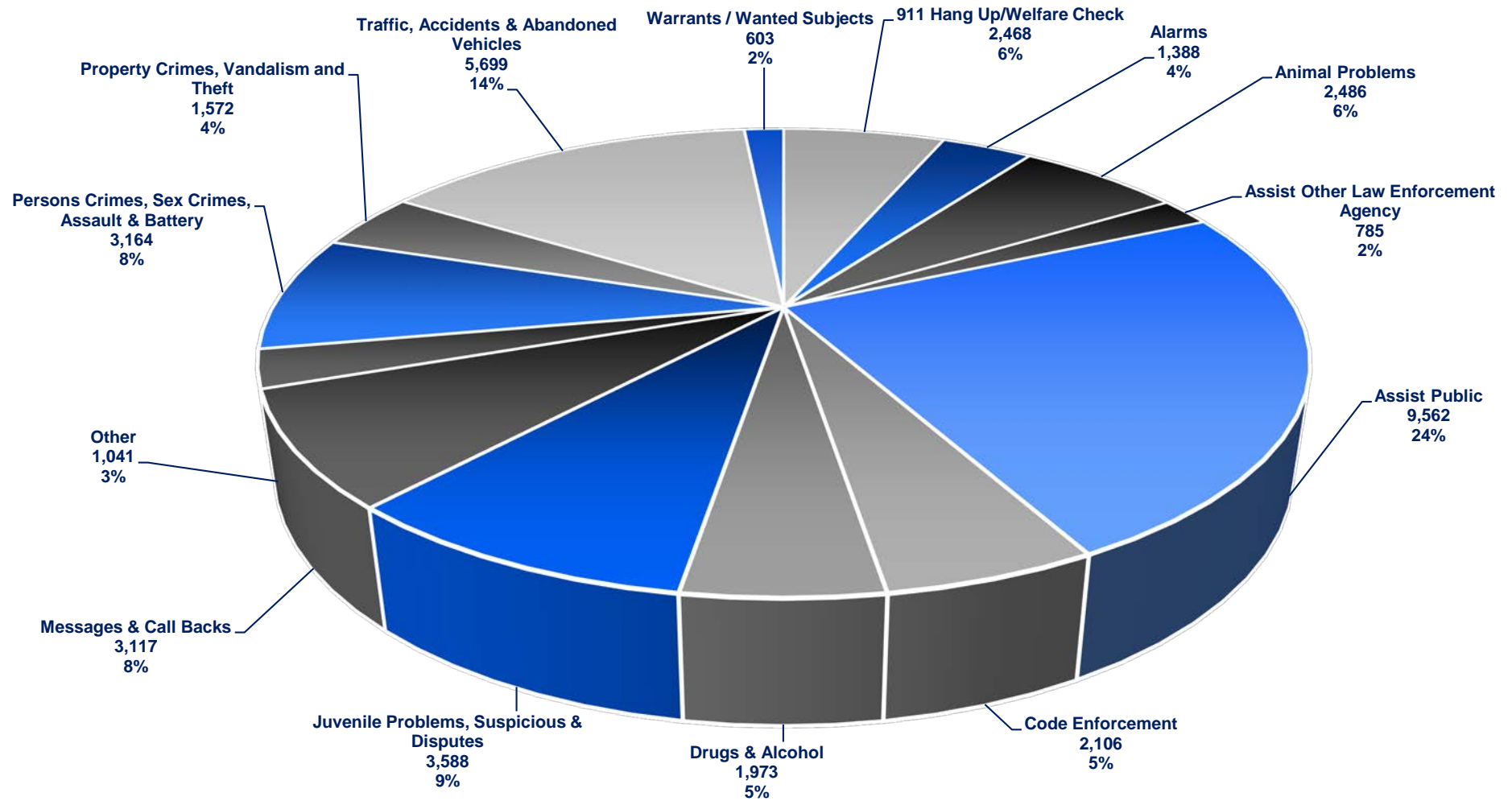

2025 by Type

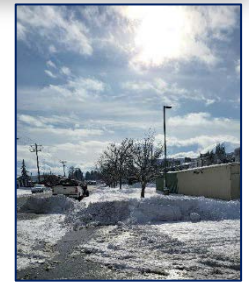
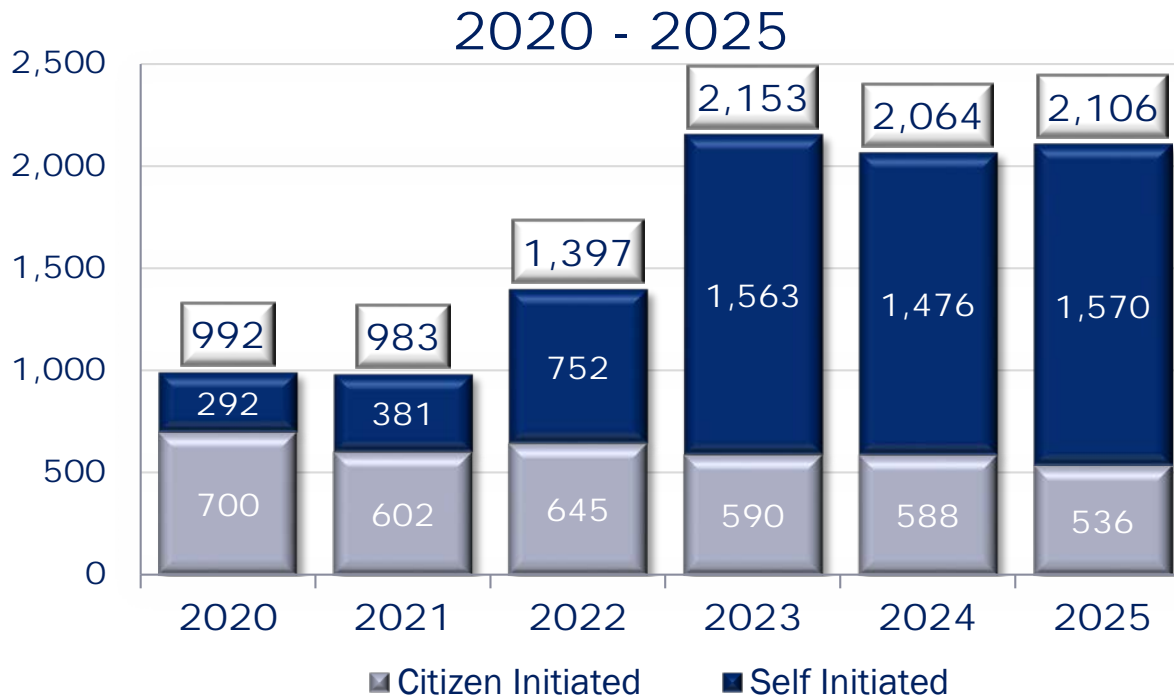




CODE ENFORCEMENT

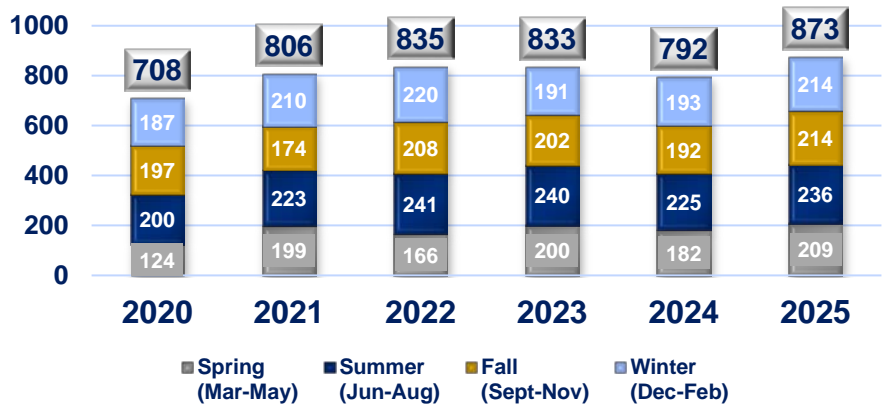


Types of calls that Code Enforcement typically handles include:

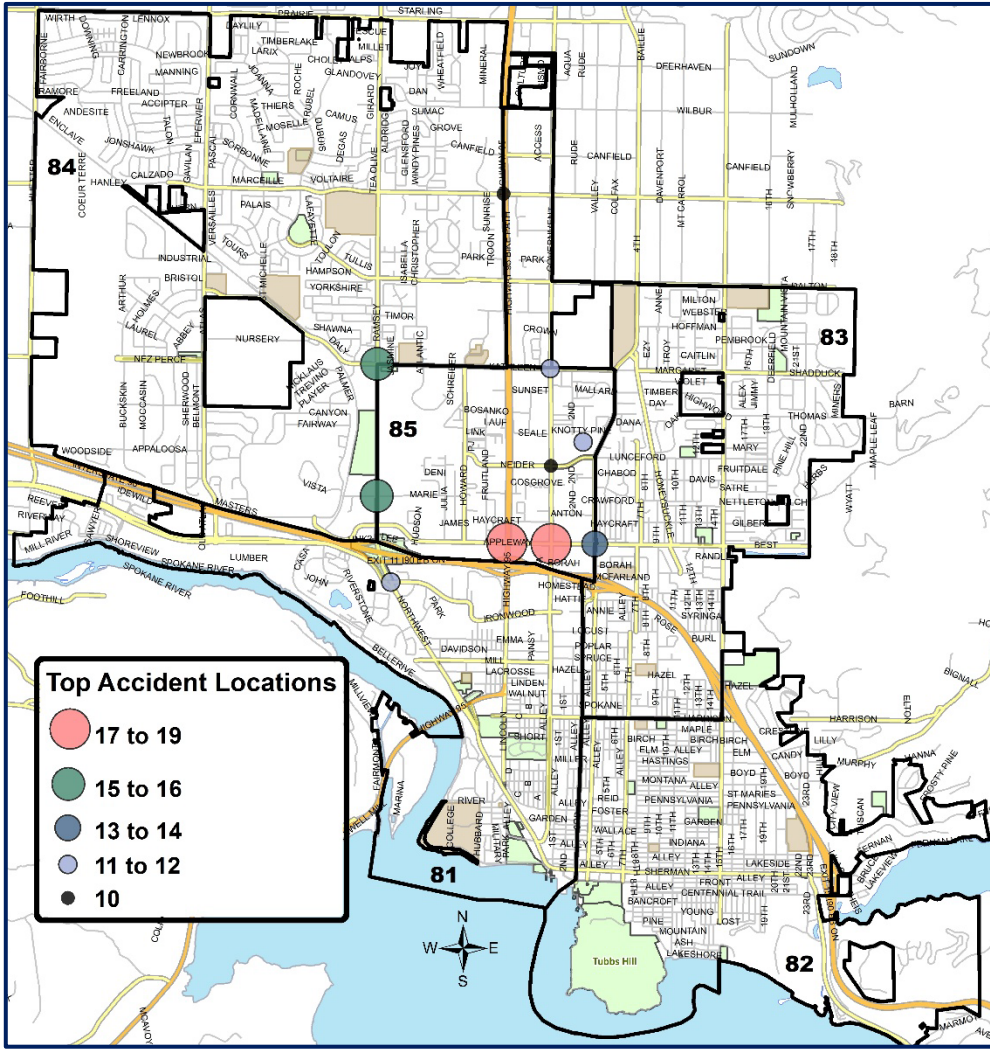

Coeur d'Alene Police: Volunteer Program

Volunteers spend time serving Patrol, Records, Community Relations Unit and COPS (Citizens on Patrol) program.

Our nine civilian volunteers spent 948 hours serving the department in 2025. During this time, they handled 584 abandoned vehicles (24 towed) and issued 485 parking related citations.



Volunteer efforts free up more officers for criminal investigations and patrol related duties, and we are very grateful for their efforts.

Sgt. Greg Moore, Remembered


May 5, 2025 marked the 10-year anniversary of the passing of Coeur d'Alene Police Department Sergeant Greg Moore, a brave and dedicated police officer who made the ultimate sacrifice for our community. Sgt. Moore's commitment to serving and protecting us will forever be remembered.

Greg's family, friends and community gathered to reflect on his legacy and to honor his memory and the impact he had on those around him.

"Greg Moore was killed protecting the life and property and the way of life of the citizens of Coeur d'Alene, Idaho," Chief White said. "He will never be forgotten."

Sgt. Beach, Medal of Honor Recipient

Sgt. Beach was awarded the Idaho Medal of Honor on August 12, 2025. Recognizing her extraordinary act of courage, going above and beyond the call of duty to save a life while risking her own.

Beach saved a wounded officer's life during a shooting in 2018, returning fire at an armed suspect before exposing herself to gunfire to extract her seriously injured colleague and transport him to the hospital for live-saving treatment.

The recognition and gratitude is well deserved, congratulations Sgt. Beach.

For conspicuous gallantry and exceptionally meritorious conduct at the risk of life above and beyond the call of duty.

On February 27, 2018, Sergeant Taylor Beach and her partner responded to a traffic stop to assist an officer who had identified a fugitive with felony arrest warrants. The suspect exited the vehicle with a firearm and shot at the officers seriously injuring the trainer officer. Sergeant Beach returned fire as the third officer moved to communicate with dispatch and additional officers. Sergeant Beach engaged and pressed the suspect to eliminate the threat to the officers and the community. Sergeant Beach determined that additional responding officers had arrived to aid in the apprehension and exposed herself to potential gunfire by placing herself between the suspect's location and the severely wounded officer. She began rescue efforts and assisted him into a patrol vehicle. Though exposing herself to potential harm, she extracted the officer and took him to the nearest hospital for treatment. This quick action and response saved that officer's life. The suspect was later found succumbed to injuries from the exchange of gunfire.

Through indomitable courage, complete disregard for her own safety, and profound concern for the safety of others, Sergeant Taylor Beach showed great determination and bravery. Sergeant Beach's extraordinary heroism and selflessness, with danger to her own life above and beyond the call of duty, are in the highest traditions of the Coeur d'Alene Police Department and Idaho law enforcement.
