

Seltice Way Revitalization

After months of planning, design, and public outreach, the Seltice Way Revitalization project is finally underway! This long-awaited project is intended to change the character and potential of this area.

WHAT'S HAPPENING?

If you've been near the site, you've probably noticed the entire stretch of eastbound lanes has been removed. After a slow start due to rainy weather, a portion of the existing concrete roadway, originally constructed in the 1940's, has been removed. That concrete is being crushed onsite and placed in stockpiles to be used in the new road construction.

Select tree removal has finished up in the median and on the south side of Seltice. As promised to the public, as many trees as possible were saved and will become part of the newly revitalized Seltice Way.

TRAFFIC REVISIONS

To ensure safety to the public and construction personnel, and to maximize construction efficiency, major traffic revisions have been implemented. During Phase 1 of construction, the entire south half of Seltice Way (existing eastbound lanes) is closed to the public, and detours have been put in place for the Mill

We understand travel through this area right now is inconvenient. Such is the nature of road construction, especially for a project this large. If you can't take an alternate route, we ask for your patience as you watch Seltice Way change a little each day.

WHAT'S NEXT?

Over the next couple weeks you can expect to see ongoing crushing of existing concrete. You'll also see underground utilities, including water and sewer be installed, starting at the west end of the project.

Within three weeks, the contractor will begin construction of the new road subgrade and roundabouts at the intersections of Grand Mill and Atlas Road.
