



STAGE 2 FIRE RESTRICTIONS



ONLY YOU CAN PREVENT WILDFIRES.



PROHIBITED: Building, maintaining, attending, or using a fire, campfire, or stove fire, including charcoal, coal, and briquettes (except for private landowners using propane grills or properly using and disposing of charcoal on their own lands.)



PERMITTED: Using a stove or grill that is solely fueled by pressurized liquid petroleum or LPG fuels that can quickly be turned off. These devices must be used in an area clear of flammable material.



PROHIBITED: Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle, trailer, or building, or area cleared of flammable material.



PROHIBITED: Operating or using any internal combustion engine or chainsaw without an approved spark arrestor. Equipment use is prohibited from 1:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m.



PROHIBITED: Blasting, welding, grinding or other activities that generate flame or flammable material.



PROHIBITED: Possessing or using a motor vehicle off established roads, motorized trails, or parking areas.



PROHIBITED: Using explosives, including fireworks, flares, exploding targets, or incendiary devices. (Always prohibited during closed fire season on all state and private forest and range land. Always prohibited on all federal public lands.)

*A patrol is required for 1 hour minimum or 3 hours for any forest operations contract following cessation of work
